Important Information

1. The student must submit a separate application for each scholarship for which he or she wishes to be considered.
2. Applicants are STRONGLY ENCOURAGED to have their counselors or teachers review applications before submitting them. Counselors/teachers should review to be sure that applicants have fully complied with instructions. Applications for which applicants have not followed instructions will not be considered. (**Counselors/teachers should verify that the Tech Prep program information is correct.** Refer to the "Programs of Study" section of the "For Educators" section of Tech Prep RGV's webpage at <http://www.techpreprgv.com/educators/articulation.html> for additional information.)
3. Each scholarship awarded by a college or university is subject to the rules of that particular college or university. Generally this requires students to remain in good academic standing and to be enrolled full-time. Each student who receives a scholarship for a particular college or university will be given the name of a contact in the Financial Aid office of that college or university. 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INSTRUCTIONS FOR APPLICANTS

FIVE SCHOLARSHIPS: Tech Prep of the Rio Grande Valley, Inc., is pleased to announce the Twelfth Annual Dr. Lauro F. Cavazos Tech Prep Scholarship competition. Five Cavazos Scholarships will be awarded, as follows:

- A \$5,000 scholarship to any College or University
- A \$4,000 scholarship for Texas State Technical College Harlingen
- A \$3,000 scholarship for The University of Texas at Brownsville and Texas Southmost College
- A \$3,000 scholarship for The University of Texas-Pan American
- A \$1,000 scholarship from United Launch Alliance to a student majoring in engineering (or a two-year engineering-related degree program) good for any college or university.

The \$5,000 scholarship and the \$1,000 United Launch Alliance scholarships are awarded directly by the Tech Prep RGV Board of Directors and are subject to rules of the Tech Prep RGV Board of Directors. Each scholarship funded by a college or university is subject to the rules and regulations of the college or university funding the scholarship. Each student who is awarded a scholarship will receive written notice from Tech Prep RGV that the scholarship has been awarded. The written notice will explain the guidelines applicable to the scholarship. Generally, those guidelines are as follows:

- For the scholarships funded directly by Tech Prep RGV, the awards will be paid in four equal installments for the freshman and sophomore years of college. The scholarship recipients will receive guidelines and forms to be completed and returned to Tech Prep RGV.
- For scholarships funded by colleges and universities, each recipient will be given the name of a contact in the Financial Aid office of that college or university. These Financial Aid contacts will explain the rules applicable to the scholarships for their institutions.

Continuation funding for all scholarships is contingent on compliance with performance requirements applicable to the individual scholarship (for example, the scholarship recipient may be required to maintain full-time status and a 3.0 GPA). The requirements applicable to each scholarship will be explained by the representative of the organization funding the scholarship: the appropriate staff member of Tech Prep RGV or the Financial Aid officer of the college or university.

ELIGIBLE APPLICANTS: Eligible applicants are high school graduates who graduated as Tech Prep Texas Scholars after the fall semester 2009 or who will graduate as Tech Prep Texas Scholars at the end of the spring semester 2010. **Applications for students who do not meet the selection criteria will not be considered.**

Applicants are strongly encouraged to have a counselor or a teacher review their applications prior to submitting them.

Some applications have been disqualified for routine errors (such as not correctly identifying Tech Prep courses [articulated courses and/or dual/concurrent enrollment courses] and Tech Prep programs at colleges), and counselors or teachers should be able to assist applicants with answering these questions correctly. In addition, counselors or teachers should review applications to be sure that applicants have fully complied with instructions. Applications for which applicants have not followed instructions will not be considered.

Applications must be complete and in order, as follows:

- First: Scholarship Application Cover Page (form enclosed in this package).
- Second: Three separate letters of reference (forms enclosed in this package)--two from school personnel and one from a personal reference who is not a family member
- Third: Tech Prep Career Essay (form enclosed in this package)
- Fourth: Copy of a High School transcript reflecting a Tech Prep program of study

Applications may be mailed or hand-delivered, but must be received by the stated deadline. Late applications, partial applications, and faxed applications will not be accepted.

RECOGNITION CEREMONY:

Scholarship recipients may be invited to participate in an awards ceremony sponsored by the Tech Prep RGV Board later in the year. In addition, applicants may also be honored during ceremonies at their current schools.

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CRITERIA THAT MUST BE MET:

1. The applicant must be a fall 2009 or spring 2010 Tech Prep Texas Scholar high school graduate.
2. The applicant must have graduated from, or be preparing to graduate from the high school portion of a College Tech Prep program for which there is a plan in place with South Texas College, Texas State Technical College Harlingen, or Texas Southmost College. Schedules of these programs can be viewed on Tech Prep RGV's website at this address: <http://techpreprgv.com/educators/articulation.html> **THE NAME OF THE COLLEGE TECH PREP PROGRAM MUST APPEAR ON THE FRONT PAGE OF THE APPLICATION.**
3. The applicant should have participated in (or be scheduled to participate in, prior to graduation), a work-based learning experience. Work-based learning experiences include experiences similar to these: an industry speaker's presentation to the student's class (as in a career day or a Texas Scholars presentation); a career fair (e.g., the Education & Career EXPO); a field trip to an employer's place of business; job-shadowing; mentoring; an apprenticeship; an internship, externship, preceptorship, or co-op class; and so forth.

REQUIREMENTS FOR CAREER ESSAYS:

1. The applicant must submit a two-page essay explaining why he/she chose to pursue graduation honors as a Tech Prep Texas Scholar graduate. This essay should describe the **College** Tech Prep program named on the front page of the application and any other information the applicant believes is relevant (e.g., information about a related career concentration/career major/career pathway chosen by the applicant while he/she was in high school).
2. The essay should include a description of the Tech Prep course(s) in which the student has participated (which may be locally articulated courses, statewide articulated courses, and/or dual/concurrent enrollment courses included in Tech Prep plans developed with local colleges) and should explain the reason that the student does or does not plan to complete the associate degree portion of the College Tech Prep graduation plan after graduating from high school. (The courses should correspond to the six-year plan information for the **College** Tech Prep program.)
3. If the applicant is applying for a scholarship to UTPA, UTB/TSC, or TSTC, the applicant should explain why he/she has chosen to pursue post-secondary education at that college or university. If the applicant is applying for the \$5,000 scholarship or the \$1,000 ULA engineering scholarship, the applicant should name the college or university he/she has chosen and explain why he/she wants to pursue post-secondary education at that institution.
4. The essay should explain the applicant's career goals, tell why the student has chosen to pursue this career area, and describe the place wherein the applicant sees himself or herself in the workforce ten years from now.
5. The essay should also describe any work-related experiences the applicant may have had in this field.

6. If the applicant's choice of a career field was influenced by someone who is currently in that field, the essay should include an explanation.
7. The essay **MUST** be either typewritten or computer-generated
8. The essay must be no more than **two double-spaced** pages in length using 12-point type
